

### The Story of Your Project

The project was a musical one called "Sing your Soul Sunny". It ran from September 23 and culminated in a concert on 27 January 2024. Our 10 elderly members wrote the lyrics to a song with the help of Dan Price (Musical Director of The Soul Choir) who then set the lyrics to music. The Sharing Memories members then learnt the song and went on to teach it to various choirs: The Soul Choir, Amazing Acapella, Far Cry, Meltham Community Choir, True Talent (a theatre school for youngsters in Huddersfield) and extra-curricular school choirs from South Crosland and Shepley schools.

The group also made banners to decorate Holmfirth Parish church where the concert was held. The concert was deemed a huge success – there were over 200 performers and 400 in the audience – standing room only. The concert brought together the local community to showcase and promote wellbeing through song and the fabulous choirs we have in our local area. It was an apt project that took place in Kirklees year of Music. We even managed to get it covered on the BBC Look North TV news.

The Story of Your Project contd.

	What you achieved
What were the benefits of your project?	Singing is proven to aid wellbeing, helping both physical and mental health. We could see this in action with this musical project. The initial lyric writing helped our members relive their memories and the song itself focused on how to Sing Your Soul happy when you are down. We could see our members visibly enjoying the music making and given that we have 2 members hwo can no longer see, they could clearly benefit from the project more than they would from a more visual arts project. We also have 3 members with dementia and singing and remembering the songs they liked in childhood & earlier adulthood was clearly enjoyable for them, improving their mental health, alertness, memory and concentration.  Seeing the success of the concert itself gave all our members and incredible sense of achievement with over 200 people singing their song simultaneously. The concert also created a strong sense of community and was something that all ages involved enjoyed. The youngest was 6, the oldest our member Ken at 99!
Who benefited from the project?	Our 10 members, 2 volunteers, members of the choirs (200 in total), the families and friends of all the performers (over 400). The project also gave an occasion for the local choirs to perform and be seen / heard.
How many people benefited?	Over 600 in total
Was the project inclusive? How were marginalised groups (elderly, disabled, young people etc) able to	Yes – it involved the elderly, young primary schoolchildren, and disabled (several people who had no sight, some with dementia, one physically disabled. We asked the Bridgewood Trust and their adults with learning disabilities to join us but

participate?	they declined this project. We also asked if the adults recovering from mental illnesses who were resident at Enfield Down in Honley if they wanted to get involved but they declined involvement for this project as they had just been involved in another singing project.  We did, however, run two open singing sessions at The Mission in Huddersfield - the centre for vulnerable people: homeless, refugees for example,. where we again taught participants on the day our song.
Reflecting on climate change, did the project address any aspects of the climate emergency? How?	It was all locally based so involved little transport. We used recyclable materials for our church decorations – in effect paper banners.
Did you achieve what you were trying to do?	Absolutely! We were delighted at the success of the project, particularly its intergenerational and inclusive nature. The concert at the end was a huge success with a far bigger audience than we had anticipated. Being on TV also raised the profile of Sharing Memories and the ambitious nature of the projects we run.

invoices are sent – there are 2 missing – one for £20 in Sept & one for £55 in Nov as our printer was not working.		
The total expenditure on the items that we thought we would be spending on was £824.75, less than the £1500 originally budgeted for several reasons:  Some of the grant funding schemes that we had	£	
applied for did come in so being short of funds overall, we had to amend plans accordingly to fit the funds that we had:		
<ul> <li>Our Project Manager started transporting members to sessions where possible and one of our volunteers started transporting some members home thus saving on taxi costs.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>We switched to running our sessions at The Phoenix Centre Holmfirth, rather than the Tech as it was considerably cheaper.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>However we spent more than budgeted on our visiting artists. (Musical Directors Dan Price &amp; Jenny Goodman). It became clear that we need them more than originally thought to not only rehearse choirs / groups, but also to refresh nearer the concert date, so we spent £1770 instead of £1350 planned, a difference of £420. We would like to ask that the HVPC grant may cover this difference instead. I have put in copies of the invoices of all the visiting artist sessions</li> </ul>		
Our Project Manager worked gratis for all months except for December.		
<ul> <li>We hope that you will also agree to us using the remainder of the HVPC grant to part- cover the cost of our resident support artist for 2 sessions that she attended in December totaling £340</li> </ul>
