A new tongued and grooved ceiling panel system was fitted over the old plywood, levelling the ceiling in the tearoom, mens and ladies toilets and the kitchen. Five old striplights were replaced with LED spotlights (club funded) to improve the energy efficiencies.

What were the benefits of your project?	The overall ambience of the tearoom and associated areas is vastly improved and will enable further improvements to décor and layout to proceed.			
Who benefited from the project?	CMCC draws cricket players and teams from the Holme Valley and beyond and provides facilities for locally based junior football teams and families. We supply changing facilities for Cartworth Moor and Holmfirth Town Football Clubs. The Easypave Cricket Club also			

How many people benefited?	 use the ground for their Evening League Fixtures, and Holmfirth Harriers use the facilities three times a year for their fell race events. CMCC have a playing pool of approximately 30 players, predominantly in the 18 – 50 age group. Match days see around 40 people participating and watching. We have a diverse multi-cultural group of players, supporters, families, and others who use the facilities and who mainly live and/or work locally. The Holmfirth Town Junior Football teams using the ground are all Under 9 and can number 80 together with more senior coaches and parents. It is used for training during the summer months as well as for games during the football season. Cartworth Moor and Holmfirth Town Football Clubs would predominantly fall into the 16 – 40 age group, and number around 30 people on match days. Easypave CC would fall into the 20 – 60 age group, around 30 people per game. Holmfirth Harriers also use the club facilities three times a year for prestigious race events, spanning all age groups, with 300 runners in the largest event.


Cartworth Moor Cricket Club Improvements Report February 2024

Following the grant made by Holme Valley Parish Council from the Community Assets Support Committee Fund, the club is pleased to report the conclusion of this stage of the pavilion improvements.

Our cricket pavilion is a prefabricated concrete structure purchased second hand some 20 years ago and is now over 40 years old. It was resited at Cartworth by the club volunteers when money was tight and material savings were made where practical. The main area of the pavilion used as the tea room and catering facility had ageing thin plywood ceilings which were beginning to sag. To improve the appearance and ambience of the room we applied for funds to refix a tongue and groove UPVC panel system, and at the same time replace the old strip lights with a more efficient and environmentally friendly LED lights.



The existing ceiling and exposed electrics prior to the work. Six old fluorescent striplights have been removed to be replaced with more environmentally friendly LED spotlight units to be sunk into the new ceiling, funded by the club.







The completed ceiling with new lighting installed.
